

HANDSCHARSTRIKE

This range of figures enables you to recreate the struggle for Muslim independence in WWII Bosnia, against the communist partisans and nationalist Cetniks on the wargaming battlefield.

The 13th Waffen SS Division "Handschar" was raised in the spring of 1943 from Muslim and Croatian volunteers as part of an ambitious plan to create a Muslim state in the Balkans under the control of the SS. Trained to the highest standards in France and Germany (to escape Croatian interference) the men of the Handschar entered the terrible battlefield of Bosnia early in 1944. Wearing the traditional fez and observing traditional Muslim religious customs, they gained a fearsome reputation in combat, giving and expecting no quarter as they cleared Bosnia of their traditional enemies.

As the tide of war turned on the axis occupiers in the Balkans the men on the Handschar found themselves fighting a bitter war outside their security zone. This led to some desertions by some elements fearing for the security of their families, many Muslim volunteers were released from service and continued a guerrilla war in Bosnia in a vain hope of keeping the idea of a Muslim state alive.

THE FUHRER'S FIREMEN

From 1943 until the end of the war the 'Gross Deutschland' Panzer Grenadier Division fought some of the toughest battles against the advancing Red Army. As the premier division of the German Army it naturally fought in some of the most desperate sectors of the Eastern Front and to support its task received the best military equipment the German arms industry could produce. During 1943 the men of the 'Gross Deutschland' began to receive the best stocks of the new camouflage smock and helmet cover, (made from linen drill and printed in Sumpfmuster 44 pattern) it provided some protection as the GD aggressively attacked/defended against superior odds. This unique body of men can now be recreated for the Wargamer with this range of 20mm figures. They are suitable for other German Infantry who were also issued with this valuable camouflage uniform.

GERMAN FALLSCHIRMJAGER HEAVY SUPPORT WEAPONS 1939-45

The light flexible role given to the German Fallschirmjager in the early part of the war made heavy support difficult to provide. Many weapons were dropped by parachute (in containers) and some were damaged on landing due to their weight. This and other difficulties with moving the weapons around meant they were less popular with the troops and were rare on the battlefield, but such weapons did exist.

2cm PZB 785(s),(i) 1939-42

Swiss made gun obtained in small numbers for Fallschirmjager troops. It was broken down and dropped by parachute in three canisters and assembled on landing. It was fired from the shoulder on blood legs in either full-auto or semi-auto mode from a 5 or 10 round magazine. Heavy recoil and inaccuracy in full – auto mode meant that it would normally be fired on semi–auto. It was effectively a long range sniper and anti – tank gun with a heavy punch. (When using it in a game you should take into account that the gunner was liable to break his collarbone when firing full – auto.)

2cm PZB 785(s)(h) 1939-42

This was the better (Glider) version and was dropped in two parts: carriage and gun. It came with wheels and was much more portable than the parachute dropped (i) version. The gun was normally fired on its carriage but without wheels for greater stability and better full-auto mode use. The difficulty of transport and firing it means that it too was seldom used but gives a nasty surprise.

2cm MG151/20 Fallschirmjager mounting 1944-45

These weapons were Luftwaffe aircraft guns stripped from grounded and damaged aircraft to give the newly raised Fallschirmjager Armies for use as heavier weapons, as they were always in desperate need. The gun was placed on a variety of mountings in an effort to give better and more stable gun platforms as this weapon could only fire full-auto. The 151/20 is belt fed or drum fed and can fire all the special Luftwaffe ammunition: Tungsten-core Armour piercing, high explosive and phosphorus rounds to name but a few. This weapon could, in the hands of experienced gunner, be very deadly. Also, with its light carriage, the weapon can be moved around quickly.

GERMAN FALLSCHIRMJAGER IN TYPE 1 & 2 SMOCKS (Operation 'Granite' Against Eben Emael 1940)

Operation 'Granite' was the most daring of all the early war operations using Paratroops. The 'impregnable' fortress of Eben Emael guarded the Dutch-Belgium frontier, which the Germans had to cross for the assault across Europe. In the fortress were 2000 experienced troops manning and defending the Guns ranged-in on the surrounding area. Specially trained German Fallschirmjager used a mixture of weapons all designed for the destruction of casements.

In the late stages of the war the Luftwaffe Field Division pulled into the parachute armies all available men from airfields and anti-aircraft units to bolster the front units. Many of these combined units fought with great elan and determination, despite the fact that the war was all but lost when they were called upon. The combination units fought on the entire front from 1944 onwards. This range depicts the varied and different types of uniforms that the Fallschirmjager acquired in the later part of the war. 'THE DEVILS GUARD'

This German Army WWII collection depicts a streife or foot patrol of the infamous FeldjagerKorp an elite Corp of the Military police, they were given explicit orders to punish deserters and restore order by what ever means necessary to disorganized sectors of the front. Formed in November 1943 they operated behind the German front line, each patrol was formed using politically reliable officers and NCO's who had proved themselves on the battlefield. Their justice was swift and brutal but by using such methods they prevented the wholesale collapse of the German front line during the critical last period of the war.

WINTER SS FOR THE ARDENNES

This range of SS figures will allow the wargamer to recreate Hitler's last great gamble 'Operation Wacht Am Rhein' (Watch on the Rhine). After the hour-long bombardment lifted, infantry would advance along a 60-mile front between Monschau and Echternach in Luxembourg, probing American Defences and opening the way for a two-wave tank assault. So began the Battle of the Ardennes.

'SERPENTS OF THE DEATHS HEAD'

The Waffen SS anti-partisan mountain Battalion 'Karstjager' was formed during 1942 from Tyrolean and Italian volunteers to police the rocky border between Italy and Croatia. Its members fought an often vicious and no holds barred battle against Italian and Yugoslavian Partisans many of its men were awarded the loathsome hydra, (multi-headed serpent) and swastika anti-partisan badge.

During the summer of 1944 the unit was increased in size and re-named the 24th Waffen SS Division der SS 'Karstjager', lack of suitable recruits enabled the Germans to raise a unit with the strength of a weak brigade. This foreign unit of the Waffen SS finished WWII fighting the British 8th Army and Italian partisans fighting under the redoubtable SS General Heinz Harmel. Figures are also suitable for Army mountain troops and the famous late war ski division.

He led his renegade unit, with it's distinctive death's head badge on the upper left arm, successfully during the summer advance into the Caucasus, and succeeded in saving his unique fighting formation, which included camels, from destruction during the Red Army winter offensive. The Regiment and it's commander was absorbed into Von Pannwitz' Cossack Division during 1943 and fought on with the Axis loyally until the end of the war. During the 1942 summer campaign the Regiment wore a mix of Red Army and German Army uniforms and added either a death's head badge or white armband to the left arm.
